
The Open Door Mission, to be used for the women's facility that was recently opened in Gates. Thank you, Ruth!



## **The New Beginning for West Webster's 1935 Ford Fire Truck**



The West Webster Volunteer Firemen's Association purchased its first new fire truck on August 13, 1935 at a total cost of \$1,657.75 from the Rochester Fire Equipment Company. The new fire truck was built on a 1935 Ford 1 ½ ton commercial truck chassis and outfitted with a 400 gallon per minute front mount Barton American Fire Pump. A 200 gallon tank was built into the bed of the truck with a hose reel attached to the top of the tank. Ladder mounts were added to hold up to 3 ladders on the driver side of the truck and brackets to hold 2 suction hoses were added to the passenger side. The truck weighs in at 7,200 pounds and is 22'6" long by 7' wide. The motor is an 85hp 21 stud Ford Flathead driven by a 4 speed transmission and runs on a 6 volt electrical system.

It was now time to get serious about proceeding; the fire department had allocated the funds to have a new motor built and repairs to the pump and installation of both. Full speed



ahead to gather up all the parts for the motor and pump needed. The mounting of the pump became a real challenge as it was requested to be able to remove the driveshaft when not in use. Three trips to a drive shaft specialist was needed to come up with joints and shafts. A special front crank shaft pulley was used to adapt to the drive shaft. Drive shaft now can be removed by taking only 4 bolts out for when the pump is not in use.



Originally built as an open cab vehicle, it was converted to a closed cab truck in the early 1940's after the Rochester winter weather became too much to bear.

The firetruck was in service until 1968 at which time it was replaced with a more modern truck. The truck then underwent an in-house restoration and was repainted by Al's Body Shop of Webster for \$242 in August 1968.

Tom Smith was approached by a West Webster fireman about 2 years ago. He asked if Tom would be interested in getting some repairs done to their truck. He explained to him that over the years the engine block had gotten cracked from leaving it out in the cold. The cracks were repaired back then using JB Weld. The department now has decided that it was time to replace the motor to avoid a failure during the summer parade season. They also discussed getting the front water pump rebuilt and put back on the truck. The pump had been off the truck for a long period of time as it was broken and needed parts that were unavailable for quite some time. Many visits to Tom's shop and phone calls back and forth were done for about the first year.




By spring of this year the truck was completed with a new complete motor and outfitted with the front water pump.

Since then, the truck has been used for parades, weddings, funerals and special fire department functions.





**Crosley - Did you know?  
A Murray Stahl Muse**

In 1947 when most of the Auto companies were almost ready to launch all-new-postwar models little Crosley offered a little pickup. It's easy to forget a company that struggled to make 3,000 cars a year but one thing they did right was the engine.

The cast iron CIBA engine weighed in at a svelte 120 pounds all dressed up. It produced an unremarkable 26 HP in stock form but the little featured a 5-bolt main and in stock spool to It had a with a 2.25" bore of 2.5" stroke giving the little mill 46 cubic inches. With a little tweaking the little engines were pushing 50+ HP and running at 12,000 RPM on midget-dirt tracks all over the US; these little engines held together at this rotational speed.

We tend to think that the trend to high-revving little engines began offshore just a few years ago but here was Crosley in 1947 with a robust little powerplant bucking the still prevalent long-stroke, flathead engines designed in earlier decades.

The Crosley brothers spent enormous sums in a failed quest to remold the conventional wisdom as too what consumers want. The entire enterprise revolved around changing people's minds about what transportation should be; they touted simple and economical in an era of bigger luxury. In the same era, we had Tucker and Kaiser, today we have Tesla testing conventional wisdom while generating enormous balance sheet losses.



The Big-Three companies went a different way and

severely cheapened their base models; the Plymouth Savoy, Chevy 210 and Ford Mainline were striped to the bone of anything that might cause an inadvertent smile when you were driving; they were the equivalent of dressing like a hobo to a formal dance and they were spectacular failures. BTW, the Studebaker Scotsman takes the trophy as being totally honest about what they had on offer; a radio wasn't even an option you could add; only a cheapskate completely devoid of good taste would buy one.



Cars have always been an extension of the buyer's personality or at least what he or she wants you to perceive as the statement of his reality. Very few people wanted to be seen as the cheapest, oddest person in any social circle. In my memory only the VW Beetle sold a cheap car at a cheap price (I think through very clever advertising) and got it perceived as "chic". As for selling the economical car; consider that large trucks and SUVs are today's best sellers with Gasoline hovering around \$3 a gallon. In the fifties gas was about \$.35. Simple, economical cars devoid of accessories and style are a very hard sell to the average buyer; today, even a bottom of the line car will have air conditioning, power brakes & steering with a radio and power windows.



And so, it goes. *Fini, Murray*





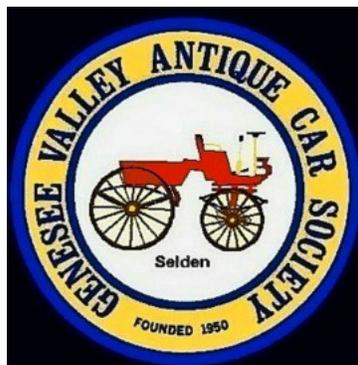
